

November 2026 State & Federal General Election Information

On **Tuesday, November 3**, registered Tellico Village voters will have the opportunity to vote for state and federal offices and consider **three proposed amendments to the Tennessee Constitution**.

To help residents prepare for the election and learn more about the proposed constitutional amendments and other important voting information, the **TVRA Civic Affairs Committee** is providing this nonpartisan resource.

Important for Monroe County voters: Monroe County uses **convenient voting**, allowing registered Monroe County voters to vote at any open polling location in the county rather than being limited to a polling location based on their residential address.

Proposed Tennessee Constitutional Amendments ([Provided by TN Secretary of State](#)):

Three proposed amendments to the Tennessee Constitution will appear on the November 3 ballot. The summaries below are intended to provide a general description; voters should review the complete official amendment language and information provided by the Tennessee Secretary of State before voting.

Amendment 1 – Pretrial Release and Bail

This proposed amendment would amend Article I, Section 15 of the Tennessee Constitution concerning bail. It would authorize a court to deny bail in specified cases, including certain offenses punishable by death, terrorism, second-degree murder, aggravated rape of a child, aggravated rape, grave torture, and certain offenses for which a convicted person would be required to serve at least 85% of the sentence.

The amendment also addresses the court's responsibility to state on the record the reasons for granting or denying bail in cases covered by the amendment.

Amendment 2 – State Property Tax

This proposed amendment would amend Article II, Section 28 of the Tennessee Constitution to prohibit the General Assembly from imposing a state property tax on real, personal, or mixed property.

Amendment 3 – Crime Victims' Rights

This proposed amendment would amend Article I, Section 35 of the Tennessee Constitution concerning the rights of crime victims.

Among other provisions, the amendment would add rights related to fair treatment; information about and participation in the parole process; protection from harassment, intimidation and abuse; information concerning minimum sentences and scheduled release dates; and consideration of the safety of victims, their families and the public when decisions concerning release are made.

It would also maintain or clarify existing rights concerning information about criminal proceedings, attendance at public proceedings, notification of release, transfer or escape, communication with prosecutors, statements concerning conviction, sentencing or release, speedy resolution, restitution and information about victims' rights.
